HOW ARE SCHOOL SOCIAL WORKERS THE LINK FOR SCHOOLS?

SCHOOL SOCIAL WORKERS HELP EDUCATORS BY:

- Assessing children's environmental needs
- Networking with community agencies and organizations to assist students
- Coordinating and developing specialized services for students, parents, and families
- Developing and implementing plans to enhance students' school success
- Reporting child abuse and neglect situations
- Understanding better how facts such as family, culture, socioeconomic status, and physical and mental health can affect students' performance

Child Intervention

School Social Workers conduct face-toface discussions with parents or guardians while working with students. Through an assessment of the child's circumstances, families may be incorporated into the plan of action. The social worker is also the liaison between the family and community resources.

Individual Counseling School Social Workers are available to provide counseling services to children and adolescents.

When should I refer a student to my school social worker?

A student should be referred when the student shows sign of social & emotional difficulties which are interfering with the student's success at school.

Possible indicators that an intervention is necessary:

- Frequent absences & Tardies
- Failure to complete school work
- Poor hygiene/appearance Excessively quiet and withdrawn Frequent illnesses Appear abused or neglected Constantly disruptive
- Extremely aggressive

Child Intervention

Services are provided to assist children so that they may succeed inside and outside of school despite any personal issues. A social worker may work one-on-one with a child who is experiencing some difficulties to better understand the child's issues and develops a plan of action to get the student back on the right track toward success.

School Administration

Throughout the intervention process, school social worker consults with the teachers & school administrators. Social worker might counsel teachers regarding children who exhibit troublesome behaviors in the classroom. The social worker develops ongoing programs that can support healthy growth and development among all school children.
